* Keys to Collaboration

- * ***Initial Idea:*** Prepare a guide highlighting keys to collaboration
- * **Held 5 meetings. Participants:** Linda Dobbyn, Margot Garcia, Mark Homan, John Kovacik, Rebecca Ruopp
- * **Participants shared knowledge and experience re collaboration, researched materials on collaboration, and began compiling a resource notebook.**
- * **Group determined that: (1) training for City staff and others in collaborative techniques would be most useful, and a guide could be one outcome; (2) group would benefit from participants representing a greater diversity of organizations.**
- * **Group began identifying possible training approaches and reaching out to other organizations, but progress slowed.**

* Open Government Data Portal



- * Open Data Portals provide public with wide variety of government-generated data.
- * OIP-spearheaded initiative; were several meetings attended by TRRG members and others.
- * City retained a consultant to help develop and host Open Data Portal at cost of approx. \$60,000 p/ year.
- * Given increasing budget challenges, City Manager decided this was not an expense that could be sustained. Consultant contract cancelled.
- * City continues to host its existing data portal at <https://data.tucsonaz.gov>.

*** Neighborhood Services Enhancement**

- **City staff and Don Ijams worked together to launch a series of workshops. First workshop was held Saturday, April 16, 2016.**

- **Notification Expansion: PDSO working with IT to develop subscription based notification service that would allow more Tucson residents to receive notifications.**
- **Mediation Services: City retained Our Family Services to provide mediation services for interested Neighborhood Association leaders experiencing difficulties.**

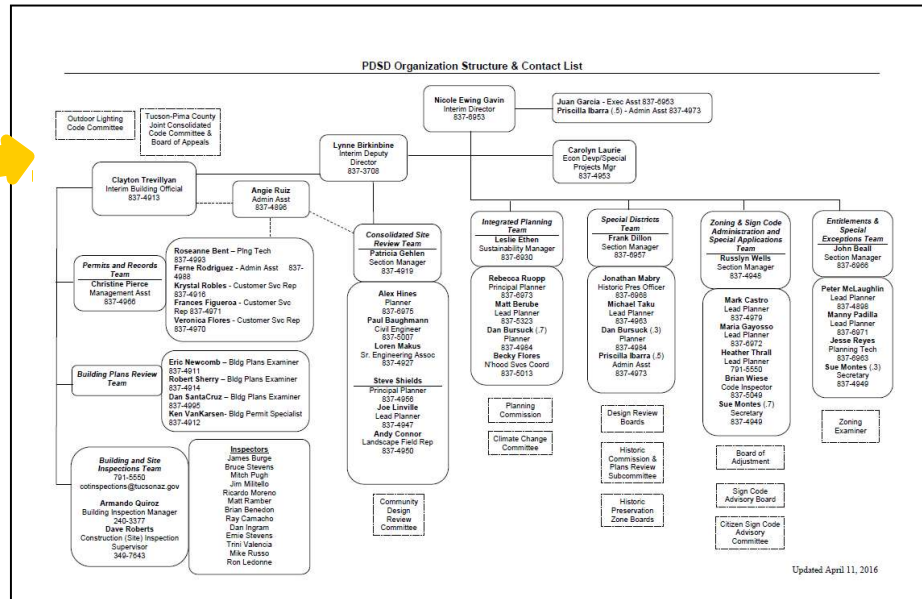
