HOW TO REVIEW YOUR SPECIFIC PLAN

Identify volunteers who will read & participate

First step:

- Read the plan and materials provided
- Discuss how you think plans are used by COT
- Review how COT actually uses plans
- Share how to access plans & read them

HOW TO REVIEW YOUR SPECIFIC PLAN

Volunteers should have read the plan

Second step:

- Discuss your plan's concepts & content
- Address questions or write down for future use
- Schedule a group fieldtrip of your neighborhood

HOW TO REVIEW YOUR SPECIFIC PLAN

Group Fieldtrip

Third step:

- Compare what your plan describes (concept map or written goals) with what is on the ground today
- Identify parcels of concern (vacant/closed/empty)

HOW TO REVIEW YOUR SPECIFIC PLAN

Response Sheet

Fourth step:

- Complete Response Sheet check-lists
- Ask among yourselves, “is the plan relevant today?”
- List ideas in your plan that you do not want to lose
- Make a copy and mail to ***TRRG***
